An invitation from Vice President of Mission and Ministry, Sr. Walter Maher, CCVI

Gifts! Gift extraordinaire! All of us love to receive gifts - and when we receive a gift, we experience surprise, delight, joy, gratitude, awe, and wonder.

The office of Mission and Ministry extends an invitation to all of us to gather as a community on October 15, 2022, from 9:00 AM - 12:30 PM | SEC Ballroom, to receive the greatest gift of all: the gift of understanding and appreciation of the greatest gift of all: God's presence in the Eucharist.

It is because God desires us, loves, us, and gifts us, that each and every one of us has received a gift that defies description, namely, the real and steady presence of his Incarnate Son, present in the Eucharist, waiting to come and dwell in our hearts.

This indwelling of the Eucharistic Lord in our hearts is the highest form of an intimate relationship with God. In other words, implicit in God's sublime gift to us is the grace of encounter - and since human beings can become fully human when they are "open to a fully relationship with God, with creation, and with one's brothers and sisters" (# 33), this is, indeed, a gift extraordinaire!

In order for us to fully appreciate the gift God gives us, however, it is necessary to understand it, to fully appreciate it, as Pope Francis has invited us to do in his Apostolic Letter Desiderio desiderave, when he said, "rediscover the beauty of the truth of our Christian celebration" (#21).

Consequently, it is necessary to be formed in liturgy and formed by liturgy because liturgy is the "source of divine communion in which God shares his own life with us" (#30) and in which we can share intimacy with God, God's creation, and all our brothers and sisters in Christ.

So, now is the acceptable time to allow the Spirit to engage us in deep reflection on the meaning and significance of the Eucharistic liturgy in and for our personal lives, as well as in the life of our University community, our state, our country, and our world.

Come! Come and accept this gift!
Come and encounter our living God in and through our common silence and reflection so that you may savor the mystery of God Incarnate, made flesh and blood, and given to you -and to each and every one of us- as a sublime Eucharistic gift.



THE LORD WHO WISHES TO GIFT US

On the 24th of November, 2013, just eight months after he was elected Bishop of Rome, Jorge Bergoglio, known to us as Pope Francis, issued the first major document of his papacy, an Apostolic Exhortation, entitled Evangelii Gaudium (the Joy of the Gospel). It was, in a very real way, typical of an Apostolic Exhortation in that it was the fruit of a Synod of Bishops ("The New Evangelization for the Transmission of the Christian Faith," 7th to the 28th of October, 2012). Yet, rather than being something of a summary or reportage of that Synod, the Holy Father strikes out on his own, in an accessible, engageable style, to set out his "own concerns about this particular chapter of the Church's work of evangelization" (Evangelii Gaudium [=EG], \$16). The Exhortation has, as the Holy Father expresses it, "programmatic significance and important consequences" for the Church of today and tomorrow (EG, \$25).

Yet, with a hint of irony and wry humor, Pope Francis noted: "I am aware that nowadays documents do not arouse the same interest as in the past and they are quickly forgotten" (EG, §25). Read more




