Step 3: Prepare Graded Assignments

Set up student assessments and understand the Canvas Gradebook. What's the difference between assignments and activities? How do I create a discussion, assignment, or quiz? What is the Assignments Index page and why is it so important? What happens when I set due dates? How do I organize Assignments to grade, including weighted grades?

Certain Canvas behaviors are automatic.

- Create an <u>Assignment or Activity</u> and will appear in the <u>Course Activity Stream</u>.
- Create a graded discussion or Quiz and it will appear in the Assignments area.
- Create a graded Assignment and it will build a column in the Gradebook.
- Set total Assignment points, Assignment Groups, and weight to craft the correct grade calculations.
- Add an Assignment due date, it will appear both on the <u>Calendar</u> and on the <u>Course Summary in the</u> Syllabus feature.
- Create and edit Rubrics. Rubrics are used as grading criteria for students and can be added to assignments, quizzes, and graded discussions. Watch the Rubric video.
 - Rubrics cannot be edited once they have been added to more than one assignment.
 - When you delete a rubric, Canvas will remove the rubric from all associated assignments in the course and remove any existing scores and assessments given using the rubric.
- ☐ Create student groups for Group Assignments. Set up groups and have students sign up before they attempt group assignments.
 - How do I add a group set in a course?

- ☐ Edit existing graded assignments that moved over from Blackboard or build new ones as needed:
 - Assignments <u>TurnItIn</u> is the plagiarism tool in Canvas.
 - Discussions
 - Quizzes and Question Banks New Quizzes are replacing Classic Quizzes in Summer 2022. Check the <u>feature comparison</u> to choose between the two.

- Organize your Assignment page to set up your
 Gradebook. Don't forget the Grading Scheme is managed in your Course settings separately from your Gradebook.

- ☐ Ensure all assignment settings and information are accurate. Use the Student View button to gain a better understanding of your student perspective and submit practice work to check grade calculations. Important Grade topics include:
